**AGREED ORDER ON TRUSTEE’S MOTION FOR ORDER LIMITING NOTICE AND  
ESTABLISHING ADDITIONAL NOTICE PROCEDURES AND MOTION FOR  
APPROVAL OF ALTERNATE FORM OF NOTICE VIA WEBSITE**

On this date, the Court considered the Trustee’s Motion for Order Limiting Notice and Establishing Additional Notice Procedures and Motion for Approval of Alternative Form of Notice Via Website (the “Motion”) filed by Robert Newhouse (the “Trustee”), the chapter 7 trustee for Debt Relief USA, Inc. (the “Debtor”) in the above-referenced bankruptcy case.

The states of Texas and Illinois, through their attorneys general, filed objections to the Motion (the “Objections”). The Trustee announced that an agreement had been reached resolving the Objections to the Motion. After reviewing the Motion and considering the record in this case, the Court finds that the announced agreement limiting notice and providing case information via

website is in the best interest of the estate and that the Motion should be **GRANTED**. In particular, the Court finds as follows:

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1334 and 157. This matter involves the administration of the estate and is, therefore, a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2)(A).

2. Venue is proper in this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

3. No other or further notice of the Motion is necessary.

IT IS THEREFORE

**ORDERED** whenever any statute or rule requires notice to all creditors and/or parties in interest (the “General Notices”), only the following parties need be served: (1) any party directly affected by such motion or request; (2) the Trustee; (3) the Trustee’s counsel; (4) the Debtor’s counsel; (5) the Office of the U.S. Trustee; (6) the twenty (20) largest unsecured creditors; (7) the Office of the Texas Attorney General and the Illinois Attorney General; (8) all persons and entities that filed a request for notice in this case including without limitation any other governmental agency. **IT IS FURTHER**

**ORDERED** the Trustee shall post all General Notices on the bankruptcy website, [www.drusabankruptcy.com](http://www.drusabankruptcy.com), along with any other case information the Trustee believes would be helpful to consumer creditors. **IT IS FURTHER**

**ORDERED** this Order is effective twenty (20) days after entry. **IT IS FURTHER**

**ORDERED** once effective, this Order and the notice attached to this Order be sent to the entire creditor matrix (the “Notice”). **IT IS FURTHER**

**ORDERED** that the Trustee is authorized to immediately pay the reasonable costs associated with disbursement of the Notice and any other pleadings or documents sent to the entire creditor matrix from the estate funds in his possession without further order of the Court.
